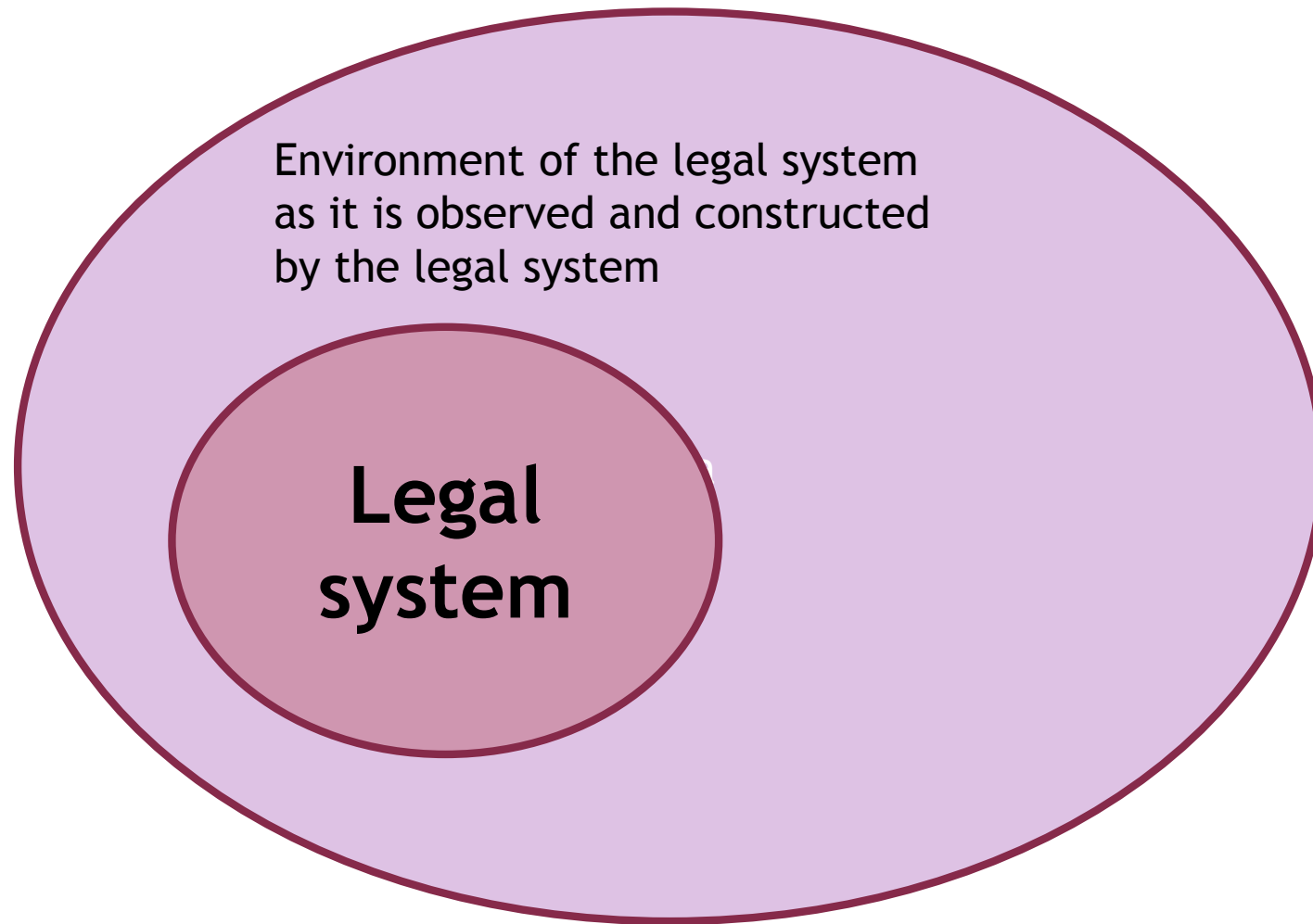

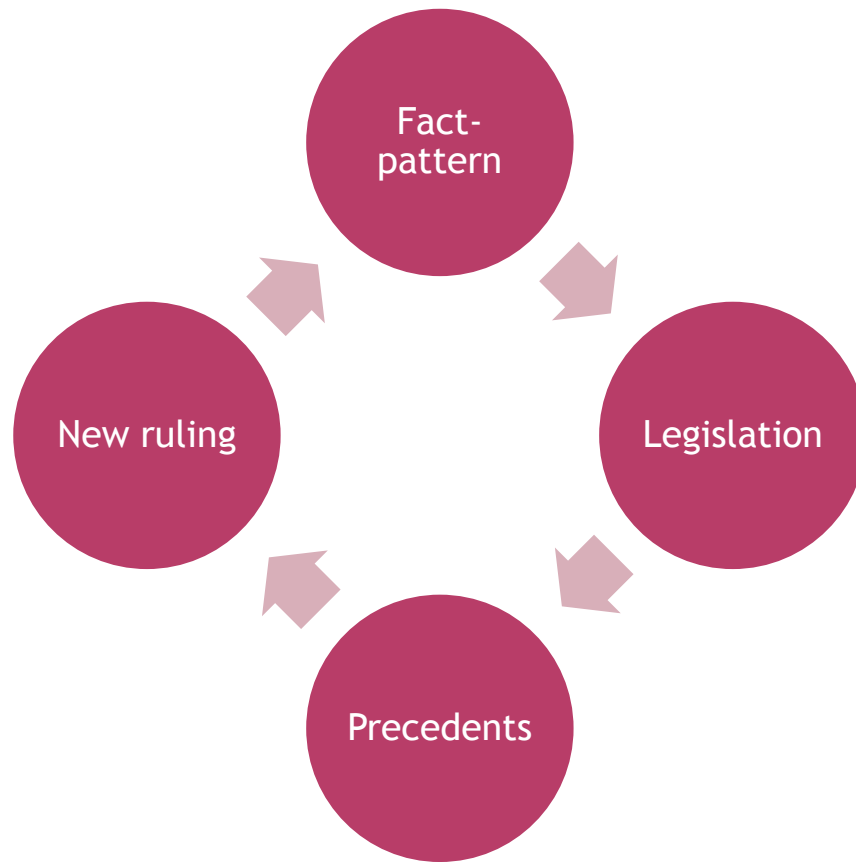

THE LEGAL SYSTEM AND ITS ENVIRONMENT



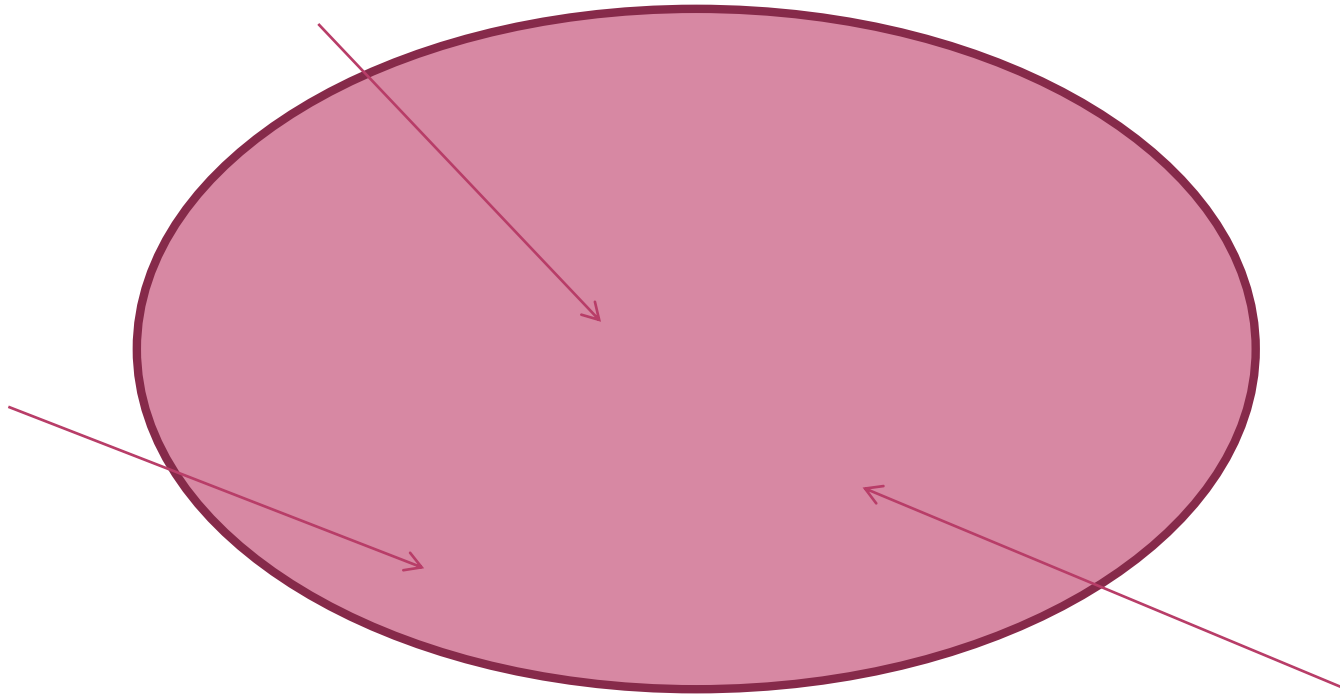

boundaries

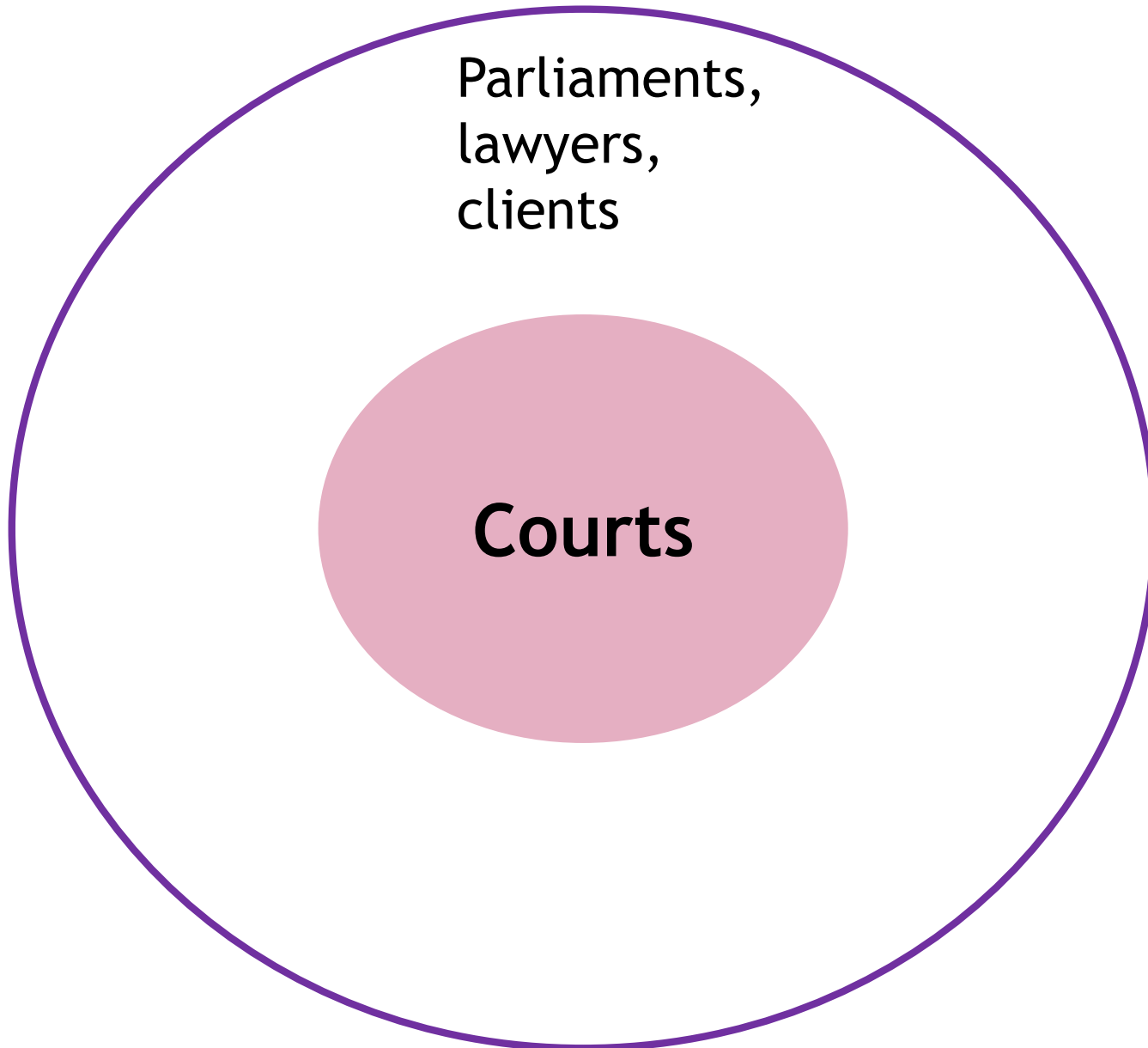
BINARY CODE

- ◉ Legal/illegal
- ◉ Lawful/unlawful
- ◉ No third value : justice, equity, morality or social desirability.
