

Geographic Area




- The court processes approximately 2,000 accused per year

MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

- Crown refers accused with mental health concerns to Forensic liaison nurse (FLN) for intake
- FLN interviews accused (brief intake assessment)
- · Accused released on bail
- Case adjourned for 20 Days
- Supervision by Probation Officer
- Case Plan developed (Watari, PO and FLN)
- FLN submits assessment report to Crown within 20 working days
- Crown accepts or rejects plan or adjourns for further progress report

CASE MANAGEMENT CLIENT PROFILE:

- 1) Vulnerable urban, socially marginalized population in need of support
 - Downtown Community Court catchment area
 - Frequent contact with justice system
 - Addiction and concurrent disorders
 - Co-morbidities with complex physical illnesses especially neurological and mental conditions
 - Low retention in existing treatment programs, frequent flyers
 - Limited or no access to care
- 2) Chronic Offender
 - Downtown Community Court catchment area
 - Frequent contact with Justice System
 - Identified by VPD Chronic Offender Program
