This conference will take place on **Tsuut'ina Nation land** adjacent to Calgary from November 4 to 6, 2024.




Indigenous Peoples at the forefront

Indigenous Peoples are best served by the system when their laws, morals, values, customs and needs are prioritized. This conference is a space for dialogue and knowledge sharing among Indigenous leaders and Elders, and actors of the legal system on how Indigenous communities design their own legal institutions and how they interact with the existing legal system to create a better justice system, reflective of Indigenous culture and values. We want to create a space for dialogue and exchange on the continuation of active education and exploration of ways to narrow the gaps and work closely with and under the Leadership of Indigenous Peoples, which is critical to all who are involved. Together, we aim to collectively identify solutions for improved collaboration and outcomes.

Focus on solutions

The various presentations, activities and panels will consider the wide ambit of realities and challenges regarding the system's ability to serve Indigenous communities, families and individuals. Are there enough resources available? Are courts and tribunals the best forum? Which other resources may be optimal to reach resolutions and improve outcomes? In person and online participants will discuss in depth, share experiences and practices, challenging the current state of affairs as we work closely towards continuous improvement. They will also experience the traditions of the Tsuut'ina Nation.


