Gonthier of the Supreme Court of Canada, a former President of CIAJ. The \$9,000 Fellowship was created in 2001 and supports research in relation to the topic of the annual conference. Each conference focuses on a specific aspect of CIAJ's themes:

- Justice as a humanistic and social value
- Justice as a public service
- Justice in a global economy and interdependent world

# **ADMINISTRATION OF FUNDS**

The funds are administered by CIAJ on behalf of the successful applicant and are available to support research assistance or other out-of-pocket expenses, but may not be used as an honorarium.

The maximum amount of the Fellowship is \$9,000. The selection of the project for the research fellowship will be made by a committee composed of the President of the CIAJ (or his/her nominee), one of the Co-Chairs of the Education and Research Planning Committee, and one other person selected by the Executive Committee.

The successful applicant will be notified in April 2024. The completed research paper must be forwarded to CIAJ by the end of August 2024.

The recipient of the Charles D. Gonthier Research Fellowship is encouraged to seek publication of the paper in a reputable scholarly publication and to indicate, in an introductory note, that financial support for the research was provided by CIAJ.

# TO APPLY

- The fellowship competition is open to faculty and graduate students at Canadian universities.
- Applicants should complete the <u>attached application form</u> and submit it by email to <u>ciaj@ciaj-icaj.ca</u>, no later than March 29, 2024.
- In addition to submission of a completed research report, CIAJ expects to receive a complete account of expenditures.
